History

The Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE) was founded in Los Angeles, California, in 1974 by a group of engineers employed by the city of Los Angeles.

Their objective was to form a national organization of professional engineers to serve as role models in the Hispanic community. SHPE became a networking entity which led to the establishment of two student chapters to begin the network that would grow to encompass the nation.

Today SHPE is a strong network of seven regions, each consisting of many professional and student chapters throughout the nation.

One of our flagship events is our annual Outreach Weekend, held at RPI and organized entirely by SHPE members. In 2017, our Outreach Staff received more than 180

applications of which 90 hardworking students were accepted. These students attended RPI for a 3-days, 2 nights event, which aims to stimulate interest in higher education and STEM majors and professions.
